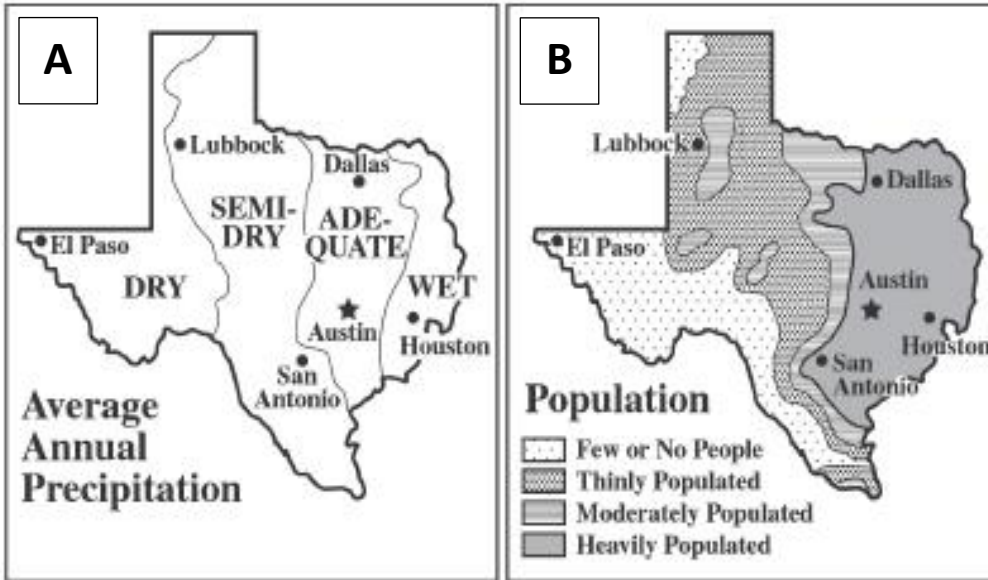



The Mexican Constitution of 1824 was a states' rights constitution. However, the Mexican government passed laws that interfered with states' powers. This created tension between Texas and the Mexican government. When Texas delegates met in conventions in 1832 and 1833, they restated their support of the Mexican government under the Constitution of 1824. Although Texans eventually became more defiant toward the Mexican government, the November 1835 Consultation declared loyalty to Mexico and support of the Constitution of
