
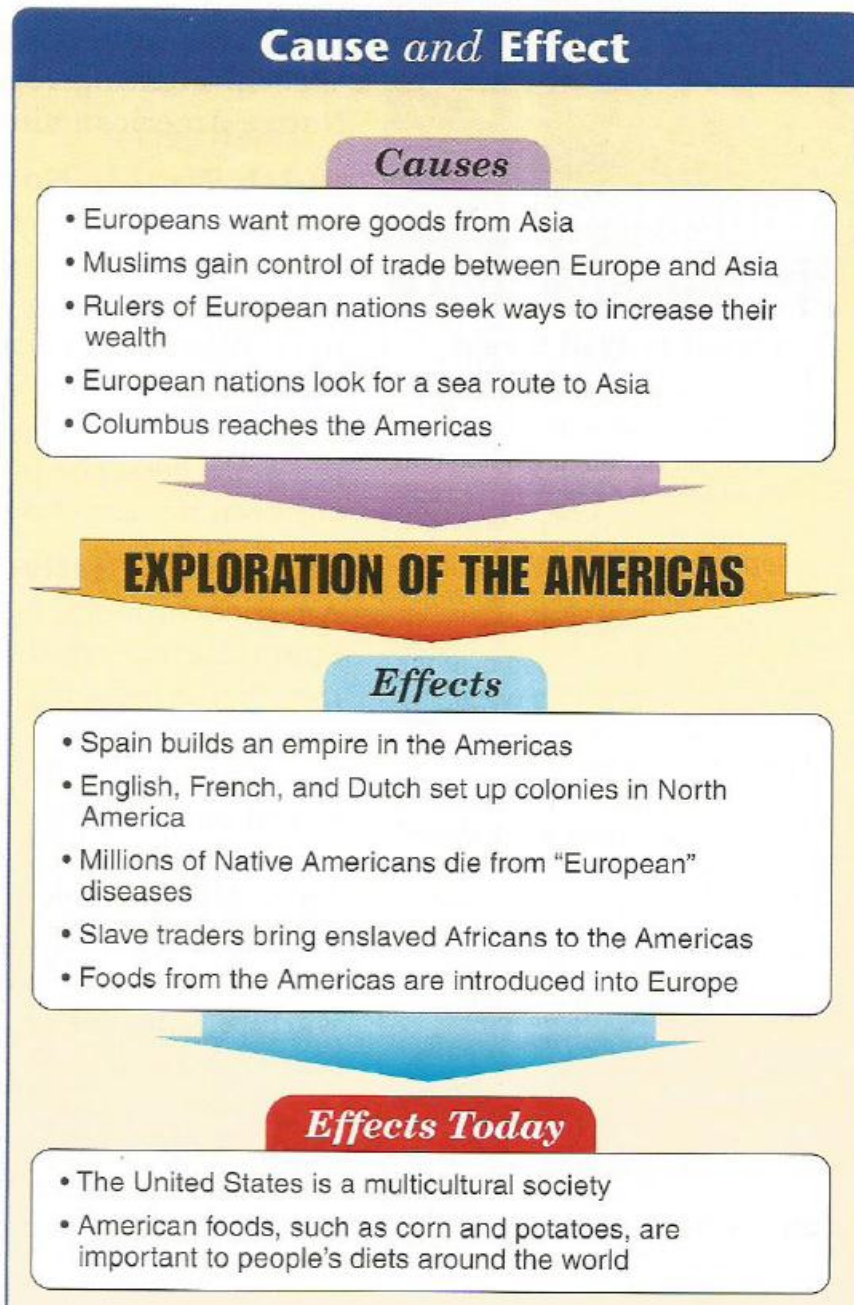


C-NOTES: Early European Exploration and Colonization

Essential Question: Why did Europeans explore the New World?

<p>Colony</p>	<p>A group of people who settle a distant land but are still ruled by the government of their native land.</p>
<p>New World</p>	<p>What Europeans called “the Americas”—across the Atlantic Ocean to the west.</p>
<p>Europe</p>	<p>A continent across the Atlantic Ocean to the east that includes the countries of Spain, France, England and the Netherlands (Holland).</p>
<p>What are the Six Cs of Exploration?</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. CHRISTIANITY: Spread their <u>RELIGION</u>. 2. CURIOSITY: Curious of other <u>PEOPLE</u>, lands, and <u>CULTURES</u>. 3. CREATE: Create <u>COLONIES</u> to expand territory. 4. CAPTURE: Capture <u>FAME</u> and <u>FORTUNE</u>. 5. COOL: New <u>TECHNOLOGIES</u> to try out like ships, compasses, navigation systems, and weapons. 6. COLLECT: Natural <u>RESOURCES</u> to sell and use.
<p>Christopher Columbus</p>	<p>Born in <u>ITALY</u> in 1451—sailed for <u>PORTUGAL</u>.</p> <p>Most people in 1400s believed the world was <u>ROUND</u>.</p> <p>Last Muslim kingdom in Spain fell in <u>1492</u>.</p> <p>King Ferdinand and Queen Isabella of <u>SPAIN</u> supported Columbus for two reasons:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Bring <u>CHRISTIANITY</u> to new found lands. 2. A new trade route to <u>ASIA</u> would make Spain (and Columbus) very <u>WEALTHY</u>.
<p>Columbian Exchange</p>	<p>Exchange of goods, people, and ideas between the Eastern and Western Hemispheres.</p>
