Class Expectations

In addition to the **CHAMPs Expectations** posted in the classroom, all students will participate in creating and honoring a **Respect Agreement/ Class Social Contract**, as well as following the guidelines listed below for success in this course and in this classroom:

- <u>Be Prompt</u> Be in your assigned seat and ready to learn when the tardy bell rings. Also, remain in the classroom once you enter the door.
- <u>Be Prepared</u> Bring all necessary supplies (pen/pencil/paper) and your Student Planner to class every day. Sharpen any pencils before the tardy bell. You will receive access to an online textbook (*Texas History*) to use at home. [Note: A hard copy of the textbook can be provided upon parental request to be kept at home, <u>not</u> at school.] Visit *Schoology* or <u>merehistory.weebly.com</u> for more information.
- <u>Be Focused</u> Follow all teacher directions the first time they are given without comment. Active listening using both eyes and ears is expected. Therefore, the most important word in this classroom: **LISTEN!!**
- Be Patient Raise your hand and wait to be recognized before speaking or leaving your seat.
- <u>Portfolio</u> All completed and graded course work will be kept in a Portfolio—<u>1" three-ring binder with five (5) dividers</u>—at all times. Your Portfolio can be kept in the classroom in the designated shelves, and they will be checked each Nine Weeks for a Major Grade; therefore, organization skills are a must. Also, you may take your Portfolio home at any time for studying and test preparation.
- <u>Warm-Ups</u> Complete the Warm-Up exercise in your Portfolio within the first five (5) minutes of class—this activity will be monitored for a Daily Grade. We will also utilize various writings (Exit Tickets, etc.) to check for understanding.
- Student Planners Update daily to organize your class work, homework, tests, and projects. Checked every two weeks (Daily Grade).
- Grading All assignments (Daily/Major Grades) are expected to be submitted on time. Any late work will be penalized according to district policy—one (1) day late = ten (10) points deducted, two (2) days late = twenty (20) points deducted, and three (3) days late = thirty (30) points deducted. Any work not turned in can receive a grade of ZERO (0) if never submitted. Failing Major Grades (including Test and Project scores below 70) will be subject to mandatory retesting and reteaching. No grades are dropped. Extra credit assignments and tutorial sessions can be made available at the teacher's discretion. Visit Schoology or merehistory.weebly.com for course information.
- Morning Tutorials (Titan Time) SLMS morning tutorials are available Monday through Friday from 8:20 a.m. to 8:45 a.m. All students must have a pass and will remain in their session until 8:45. Please check with your teacher for a Tutorial Pass and their availability.
- <u>Absences</u> It is each student's responsibility to check with the teacher for make-up work immediately upon returning to school after an absence. You will be allowed the time missed for an excused absence to make up the assignment(s) without penalty. However, ISS assignments are expected to be completed when assigned—no extra time will be given for these.
- <u>Four minutes</u> Restroom, water fountain, locker visits, and hallway socializing must be taken care of between classes—you must have a "Free Pass" available to perform these tasks during class time. Clinic visits must be for "emergencies" only. All students entering/leaving during class time must have a valid hall pass (no "10/10" passes will be issued—first 10 minutes & last 10 minutes of class period).
- <u>Tardies</u> Every class change is considered a "hall sweep" and all students are expected to arrive on time to class. Four (4) "Free Passes" are allowed during each month to leave during class for restroom and/or locker visits. These are a privilege and can be limited.
